Disasters and Destruction

English

Non-narrative writing -

• To write explanation texts; to identify features and structure; to use present tense; to use a variety of connectives.

Maths

- to use understanding of place value in numbers up to 1000
- to add and subtract mentally or using formal methods on paper
- to recall and use facts from the 4x and 8x tables
- to solve problems involving measures including money and time
- to find fractions of shapes and amounts
- to draw and describe 2d and 3d shapes and recognise right angles
- to interpret data in bar graphs

Computing

Map Detectives – navigate and explore places on a map to solve crimes.

Science

Rocks and Soils

- to group rocks bases on appearance and physical properties
- to describe how fossils are made
- to recognise that soils are made from rock and organic matter

Forces and Magnets

- compare how things move on different surfaces
- notice that some forces need contact between 2 objects, but magnetic forces can act at a distance
- observe how magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and not others
- compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of whether they are attracted to a magnet, and identify some magnetic materials
- describe magnets as having 2 poles
- predict whether 2 magnets will attract or repel each other, depending on which poles are facing.

Geography

• To find out about the Earth's tectonic plates, recognise how mountain are formed and significant mountain ranges around the world. Recognise how volcanoes are formed. Identify different types of volcano.

Art/DT

• To explore different materials and processes and to develop control of tools and techniques. Create different effects and textures using appropriate tools needed for the task.

PE

 Yoga and Athletics techniques - Acquiring and developing skills, selecting and applying skills, tactics and compositional ideas. Gaining knowledge and understanding of fitness and health. Evaluating and improving skills.

RE/PSHE
