Prime Area: Personal, Social and Emotional development (PSE)

Self-Regulation: Throughout the year children will work towards simple goals, being able to wait to wait for what they want and control their immediate impulses when appropriate. Give focused attention to what the teacher says, responding appropriately even when engaged in activity, and show an ability to follow instructions involving several ideas or actions.

Specific Area: Literacy (L)

Say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and at least 10 digraphs. Read words consistent with their phonic knowledge by sound-blending;

Read aloud simple sentences and books that are consistent with their phonic knowledge, including some common exception words.

Writing - Writing simple sentences and phrases that can be read by others.

Story writing, writing sentences using a range of tricky words that are spelt correctly.

Beginning to use full stops, capital letters and finger spaces.

Using familiar texts as a model for writing own stories.

Write a character description.
Write three sentences with beginning,
middle and end.

Using correct letter formation.
Write recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed.

Spell words by identifying sounds in them and representing the sounds with a letter or letters.

Prime Area: Communication and Language (CL)

Communication and Language is developed throughout the year through high quality speaking and listening interactions, daily group discussions, sharing circles, PSHE sessions, story sessions, singing, speech and language interventions, assemblies and weekly interventions. Listen to stories to build familiarity, understanding and increase vocabulary. Ability to speak in sentences using language to develop relationships. Retelling a story using story language. Asking how and why questions.
