- to create a sequence of movement

- to understand what a mosque is and to identify its features
- to recognise the Muslim call for prayer and to understand tis preparation
- to explain Islamic stories

PSHE – Working together

- to identify their own strengths and skills and those of others
- to identify skills they would like to develop

Music – Three little Birds – Bob Marley and Christingle performance

- To improvise and compose own music
- To explore rhythm, pitch, tempo and dynamics
- To play a classroom/ band instrument
