

The school has an answer phone available to leave a message if nobody is available to take your call. Contact the school on every further day of absence, again before 9.20am. **PUNCTUALITY** The school day starts at 8.40am when children can begin to come into school. Registers are taken at **8.50am** and your child will receive a late mark 'L' if they are not in by that time. **HOW MANY DAYS OFF?** The impact absence has on your attendance Below 90% Unsatisfactory Attendance Levels 100% Attendance = 0 days off 91—95% Cause for concern 95% Attendance=10 days off 90% Attendance = 20 days off 85% Attendance = 30 days off 96—98% Good 80% Attendance = 40 days off

### **ATTENDANCE**

99-100% Excellent

A reminder that all planned absence must be requested by parents, please. This includes absence for reasons you expect to be denied, such as for holidays or family celebrations. It is essential and lawful for schools to know where a child is if they are not at school and we follow investigative procedures when absence is not explained, as outlined in our Attendance Policy. <u>Please be aware that children are very honest about where they are going/have been if a</u> <u>term-time holiday or celebration is planned</u>. Where an alternative reason is given for absence in such cases (e.g. reported as illness), the school will follow this up and could result in authorised absence marks being changed to unauthorised.

It is appropriate at this point, to remind all parents of the law and of the possibility of penalty fines for unauthorised absence, with an extract from our Attendance Policy: Unauthorised absence may result in the school referring to the Local Authority for sanctions and/or legal proceedings. This may include issuing each parent with a Penalty Notice for £120, reduced to £60 if paid within 21 days or referring the matter to the Magistrates Court, whereby each parent may receive a fine of up to £2500 and/or up to 3 months in prison. If a parent is found guilty in court, they will receive a criminal conviction.

### SAFER INTERNET DAY - TUESDAY 7 TH FEBRUARY 2023

This year's theme is: **Want to talk about it** and we will be completing activities in school based on this topic.

The day is to **celebrate young people's role in creating a safer internet** and the ways they are shaping the interactive entertainment spaces/platforms they are part of e.g. gaming, social media, 'live' experiences such as video streaming...

These platforms play such an important and positive role, providing young people with the means to interact with friends and as a great pastime, particularly during lockdowns. However, there are some emerging safety issues in these spaces as well as issues young people have been navigating for some time; particularly the lack of respect individuals display towards each other, groups 'ganging up' against other groups, and the sense that it is easy to 'get away' with negative behaviour such as meanness, bullying and swearing.

The apparent lack of consequences for negative behaviour has an impact on safety and wellbeing. Young people need to understand what constitutes respectful behaviour online, and know what to do if they encounter hate or bullying directed at them or someone else. Be an upstander, not a bystander.
