- All teachers at Wentworth can teach to high standards with the right example through quality mentoring and coaching. Weaknesses in teaching are dealt with rigorously and effectively. Our aim is for all teachers to teach 'Outstanding' lessons with excellent planning and high quality marking and feedback for pupils.
- **High expectations and early intervention work are essential** for all pupils to strive to exceed their potential, including disadvantaged pupils and for staff to teach at their best. Our aim is for intervention work to impact on pupil progress to ensure all pupils make above National expected progress.
